At the LWVC Convention in May, 2011, delegates adopted an update of the Initiative and Referendum Process in California. Meetings will begin after the 2012 presidential election. The study committee divided into subgroups, each taking a topic to research:

- History of the initiative and referendum process, with an emphasis on California
- Description of the initiative and referendum process as it exists today in California.
- A comparison of other states and how they are using the processes for direct democracy
- Identification of key issues with the processes
- Ideas or methods for reforming the process.

Focus on the Student Courts With the Civics Education Team

The Civics Ed Team is exploring how to be helpful to a student court project at Berkeley High and in the middle schools. BHS has been running a student court where fellow students judge their peers for misbehaviors serious enough for school administrators to consider suspending the culprit. The student court hands out a sentence appropriate to the deed and tries to develop social responsibility, not just punish the infraction. After their trial, the students must obey the sentence and then serve on a jury in the trial of a fellow student. This type of restorative justice has been very successful in other cities and is expanding in Berkeley. Josh Daniels, the School Board member who helped found the BHS Court has
